DEAR Friends

Dear Alumni and Friends,

Thank you for your generous support of South Dakota Mines and the Center for Alumni Relations and Advancement (CARA) during this past fiscal year, which ended in July. Whether you chose to support academic or athletic scholarships, the Mines

Advancement Fund, a department, research, or innovation, your gifts are essential and make a significant difference to our students and faculty.

This fiscal year we raised \$9.7 million - in a challenging year. Our endowment grew to \$87 million and our overall net assets totaled \$116 million. This year we had an investment return of 17.5%; our five-year average investment return is 9.3%. We credit the market, but also the Investment Committee and their careful stewardship of the money entrusted to us. While our endowment is significant, the cost of higher education and the needs of the university continue to grow.

It has been a busy year since the Alumni Association and Foundation merged to become the entity we now know as CARA. We made significant progress this past year developing key strategic and tactical plans with specific, measurable goals to put us on a path to success. We established a mission statement which reflects our priorities to "... promote the traditions, interests, influence and reputation of South Dakota Mines among alumni and friends through meaningful engagement and by inspiring and stewarding philanthropy..." and created a vision statement to define our legacy as a "...global network of alumni and friends who advance the prominence of South Dakota Mines." We also approved a strategic plan, which includes student and alumni engagement, a significant fundraising campaign, and strengthening our operations. In all that we do, our ultimate goal is to serve alumni and friends and assist the university in meeting its strategic vision.

We are grateful for your support this past year. I encourage you to continue to invest in South Dakota Mines, a place that shaped my life, and likely yours. Our current and future students are counting on us.


Historic Gift Preserves Swindler Legacy

When Lee Swindler (EE 88) was considering how to honor his beloved late wife, Karen (ChemE 88), he decided there was no better way than to give in her memory to South Dakota Mines. The \$4 million donation to name the Karen M. Swindler Department of Chemical and Biological Engineering is the largest in the school's history. Such a trailblazing, inspirational gift perfectly befits such a trailblazing, inspirational person.

Like so many great success stories, Karen's began with humble roots. The youngest of 11 children, she grew up learning how to work hard on their family farm in Redfield, South Dakota. Gifted in math and science, she excelled at South Dakota Mines, where she met her future husband, Lee, their freshman year. Lee, from a similar family farm background in North Dakota, was charmed by Karen's outgoing personality, intelligence, and enthusiasm for the university. "She maintained that enthusiasm for the rest of her life. It fueled her tireless advocacy and volunteer work on behalf of Mines," said Lee.

Both Lee and Karen graduated with engineering degrees. Lee was an electrical engineering major while Karen was always fascinated with chemical engineering. Although in different fields, they were fortunate to eventually work in corporate leadership for the same company, LyondellBasell, the third largest chemical company in the world.

The naming gift gives Lee the opportunity to celebrate his wife's groundbreaking career. After succeeding at a variety of engineering and leadership roles, she was promoted to Senior Vice President of Manufacturing, Americas, where she oversaw 3,500 employees and 25 plants, one of the only women in charge of manufacturing for an S&P Fortune 500 company. Karen is the first female in the country to have a university chemical and biological engineering department named after her. She will long serve as a powerful role model for young women, starting first and foremost with her three young granddaughters.




The naming gift is also an opportunity to celebrate Karen's dedication to service. Although busy with her family and a demanding career, she always found time for South Dakota Mines. She presented to university classes and organizations, recruited students and championed various projects like the new Center for Alumni Relations and Advancement. She advocated for undergraduates and alumni in finding internships and positions with her company and was so proud of how well they represented the university. After retiring in 2015, she continued her service by volunteering on the Chemical Engineering Advisory Board and for the Alumni Association as board member and president.

"This is a gift that will make a direct impact on our students for generations to come," says Mines President Jim Rankin, Ph.D. "Karen was an instrumental leader who was a passionate supporter of her alma mater. We are deeply grateful for the generosity of her family."

Lee and his family, which includes their four children and six grandchildren, hope that others will be inspired by Karen's legacy as a trailblazer and dedicated alumna.

"I hope everyone who knew Karen or reads her story will be moved to act and to give. What a beautiful addition to her legacy that would be," said Lee.

At the dedication of the Karen M. Swindler Chemical and Biological Engineering Department, Lee described the four main reasons behind this transformational gift:

Giving back

"My family believes in the importance of giving back, and that it should be a priority in life. We view the talents and opportunities we have been given as gifts from God and, therefore, it is only right that we share with others and pay it forward."

South Dakota Mines as launching pad

"Karen and I always saw our South Dakota Mines education as pivotal to our career accomplishments. We went from small town farm kids to very successful engineers, and the key to unlocking that door was Mines. We have had a profound gratitude for our education and how well it prepared us to go out into industry and succeed."

South Dakota Mines as great investment

"South Dakota Mines is second to none in educating its students and preparing them for the workforce. It is so rewarding to see the school continue to improve and the students continue to be outstanding. We have always felt such a pride in the university."

Accessibility

"South Dakota Mines is as accessible now as it was when we were students. If you have the intelligence and test scores, you can get a world class education that is also financially attainable. Anyone capable and with initiative can succeed on his or her own merits without having to have money and connections. That means a lot to me."

We extend our sincere gratitude and appreciation to our retiring board members who have faithfully served the Foundation, Alumni Association and now the Center for Alumni Relations and Advancement Board of Directors. Board members are elected to serve for three years and may not be elected for more than three consecutive terms. Members give of their time, talent and treasure to help fulfill CARA's mission and to support South Dakota Mines. Cliff served on and led the Real Estate Committee. Cliff and his wife Debra (EE 78) recently retired and moved to St. Augustine, FL.

Lorin (MetE 75) and Mary (CE 77) Brass



Lorin previously served 12 years on the Foundation Board of Trustees and together the Brasses served as co-presidents of the Alumni Association. Lorin chaired the Foundation Board for seven years. Most recently they served together on the CARA Board of Directors and on the Executive Committee. Mary chaired the Governance Committee and Lorin served on the Investment Committee. Lorin's career was spent working for Shell Oil, advancing through many different roles including as CEO of Shell Services International in The Hague Netherlands. The Brasses live in Lennox and also enjoy time at their cabin in the Black Hills. Their Brass LIFE Award supports students studying abroad and they are longtime scholarship supporters for metallurgical and civil engineering.

Jim Green (ME 74)



Jim Green served on the Foundation Board for 15 years, including on the Executive Committee for six years, and one year on the CARA Board. Jim joined Caterpillar shortly after graduating from college and spent the duration of his 37-year career with the company before retiring in February 2011. He has remained active recruiting for Caterpillar on campus, serving on the Mechanical Engineering Industrial Advisory Board, serving on the university Advisory Board since its inception in the 1990s, including being chair for nine years, and championing the funding for the Caterpillar Student Excellence Center. Jim and his wife Connie proudly donated the Grubby statue on campus as a reminder of the hard-working, fun-loving spirit that has made South Dakota Mines great. The Greens have also created the Jim and Connie Green CAMP Faculty Award and the James and Connie Green Scholarship benefitting students from their hometown of Bridgeport, NE. They live in Rapid City.

Melanie Jeppesen (IS 09)



Melanie served on the Alumni Association Board for four years and one year on the CARA Board. Melanie worked at Black Hills Corporation in Rapid City for six years. Gaining Momentum



The construction of the new Mineral Industries Building is steadily moving from vision to reality. Plans have been finalized and South Dakota Mines officials are in the process of securing major gifts from industry partners, alumni and friends of the university.

The total cost of the project is \$34 million. In the last legislative session, the State of South Dakota designated the new Mineral Industries Building as a strategic priority, investing \$19 million. South Dakota Mines has allocated an additional \$3 million, which includes demolition of the current facility. That leaves \$12 million for the Center for Alumni Relations and Advancement (CARA) to raise, of which \$3.2 million has been committed to date.

We are working hard to raise the remaining \$8.8 million by March 2022, so we can break ground and start construction. We eagerly anticipate opening the new building for the spring 2024 semester.

This project will have a substantial impact on our campus, the region and even the world as we prepare the next generation of industry leaders.

I am certain the Mines students thank you for your support.







In memory of David Lust

CARA, Rapid City and the State of South Dakota lost a good friend July, 23, 2021. David was a prominent business and civic leader, former state legislator, and loving husband and father. He passed away unexpectedly from cardiac arrest. David was a business attorney at Gunderson, Palmer, Nelson and Ashmore law firm for more than 22 years. In 2006 he embarked on his political career with his election to the South Dakota State Legislature where he served 11 years, including two terms as majority leader. David's greatest impact may have come through his extensive volunteer work, among them the Rapid City Economic Development Partnership, South Dakota Mines Center for Alumni Relations

and Advancement (CARA) Board of Directors, Rapid City area Chamber of Commerce, Junior Achievement, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, and his church. He was particularly committed to his work with ELEVATE to promote economic development in Rapid City. At CARA David served on the Real Estate and Executive Committees, respectively. As said at his memorial service, "David's passing is a tragedy, but to have not known David would have been a greater tragedy." David is survived by his wife, Becky and four children; Nicholas, Isabelle, Benjamin and Samuel.


A Legacy of Excellence

Dr. Richard Gowen, who was among the most impactful leaders in the history of South Dakota Mines, passed away on Friday, Nov. 12, 2021, at the age of 86. Gowen came to Mines first in 1977 to serve as the Dean of Graduate Education, following a highly successful career both as a teacher and researcher in the fields of biomedical and electrical engineering. The Board of Regents appointed him president of Dakota State University in 1984. Later, he returned to serve as Mines president from 1987-2003.

"Dr. Gowen was among the most passionate supporters of South Dakota Mines, and his enthusiasm was contagious. He inspired many and he dedicated much of his life to the advancement of the institution. He was instrumental in shaping the university we all know today. He will be greatly missed," says Mines President Jim Rankin, PhD, PE.

Gowen led the university's first capital campaign, raising over \$20 million for new programs, faculty development, research, and buildings that continue to benefit thousands of students. He helped found the award-winning, nationally-recognized Center of Excellence for Advanced Multidisciplinary Projects. He also spearheaded the development of programs to increase the number of Native American engineering and science graduates. He created an era of progress and improvement at Mines, and his impact reverberates today as students and faculty continue to benefit from his work.

He remained a very active community leader and philanthropist into his retirement and engaged in a wide range of projects. He played a pivotal role in bringing the Sanford Underground Research Facility to the Homestake Gold Mine. For his lifelong pursuit of excellence, he was inducted into the South Dakota Hall of Fame in 2012. In 2014, he was part of the group that brought the Dignity statue to the banks of the Missouri River. In 2017, he and Nancy established the organization "Excellence in Computer Programming" and brought together numerous volunteers to help the Black Hills region host the International Collegiate Programming Contest, which brought together college students from around the world.

"He led an exemplary life and in everything he did, he approached with tireless commitment to excellence. He addressed projects as he did life: head-on and at full-speed, giving it all he had and then some, and expecting those around him to do the same," said Steve Allender, mayor of Rapid City.


